PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT PROGRAM GULF COAST STATE COLLEGE APPLICATION INFORMATION

APPLICATION DEADLINE IS 11:59 P.M., C.S.T., ON MAY 12, 2026

The physical therapist assistant (PTA) is a skilled technical health care worker who delivers physical therapy services under the direction and supervision of the physical therapist (PT). PTAs carry out treatments designed by the PT that include a variety of interventions to help patients return to function and activities of daily living. PTA duties may include instructing patients in therapeutic exercises for strengthening, flexibility, balance, and coordination; developing mobility and functional skills; applying physical agents such as heat, cold, electricity, and traction; and communicating with the PT as the patient's medical condition changes. The physical therapist assistant is responsible for monitoring and reporting the patient's response to treatment to the physical therapist. This requires the PTA to collect data, document treatments administered, and communicate findings objectively.

Physical therapy is a rewarding and demanding career field with job possibilities in all types of healthcare environments. Employment opportunities can be found in a variety of settings including hospitals, rehabilitation centers, nursing homes, home health agencies, schools, and outpatient PT clinics. According to the <u>U.S. Bureau of OLabor Statistics</u>, the mean annual wage is \$68,460, but can vary based on geographical location. The mean entry-level hourly wage for Bay & Gulf counties was reported as \$31.38, according to the PTA Occupational Profile report completed in 2025, by CareerSource Gulf Coast. To be successful in this career you should be comfortable with performing physical activity, have a strong background in science, be able to communicate well with a diverse group of people, and have an interest in disease prevention and wellness.

The Gulf Coast State College Physical Therapist Assistant program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) and accepts a maximum of 20 students per year in the fall semester. The class size may vary depending on clinical site availability and employment opportunities. Applications will be accepted any time throughout the year, but the application deadline is https://www.gulfcoast.edu/academics/academic-division/health-sciences/physical-therapist-assistant/index.html by 11:59 p.m., C.S.T., on MAY 12, 2026.

This program uses a selective admission process, and satisfaction of the minimum requirements does not automatically guarantee admission. Completed applications will be sent to the PTA Admissions Committee for review. The program is piloting <u>in-person</u> interviews for the top 30 applicants, which will not have any impact on applicant ranking during this pilot period. All applicants will be notified in writing, within six weeks after the deadline, whether they are accepted into the program, placed on an alternate list, or not accepted for the current year. No acceptance results will be given over the phone. Once "conditionally accepted" into the program, students are required to complete/pass a background check, drug screening, and physical exam, and attend a mandatory orientation in July/August. There is a strict professionalism policy required in this program and attendance is mandatory. Please refer to the <u>PTA Program Handbook</u> for details.

1) Ensure all transcripts are received by Enrollment Services & request evaluation, 2) Submit the PTA Application (documented hours may be updated through the deadline.)

The PTA Program is designed as a <u>full-time</u>, face-to-face course of study, and students are required to complete courses in the designated sequence. There is one technical course, Medical Terminology (HSC 1531), which is only offered online. Please note the fifth semester will require students to complete 40 hours/week, but there are only 10 credit hours in the PTA curriculum. This may impact financial aid status, due to the requirement of needing 12 credits for full-time status.

Most classes are offered during daytime hours with only a <u>few</u> evening courses. The PHT courses in the curriculum are offered once a year, in a particular sequence. If general education courses are completed in advance, students are still required to complete five consecutive semesters as listed above. Completing general education courses in advance would lighten the academic load for the corresponding semester, but would not decrease the total length of the program.

Students will need access to a computer with a camera/microphone and have internet access for most courses.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS:

Gulf Coast State College (GCSC) students that are granted conditional acceptance into a Health Sciences program must receive a satisfactory criminal background check prior to final acceptance into the program. The background check will be scheduled and performed at the discretion of the Division to which the student has applied. Information and instructions on how to complete the background check will be sent by the applicable program coordinator.

Please Note: Criminal background checks performed through other agencies will not be accepted. Also, be aware that clinical agencies may require an additional background check prior to clinical access. Although background checks are required before program entry, it is possible to graduate from a program at GCSC and be denied the opportunity for licensure because of an unfavorable background check. Even if the student has been accepted into and completed a program at GCSC, this does not guarantee authorization for licensure or eligibility to take the licensure exam. Those authorizations are granted by the Health Sciences governing professional licensure boards. This is a notification to the applicant that Gulf Coast State College has no authority over any state-level medical licensure board and cannot be held responsible if the student is accepted into or completes a Health Sciences program and subsequently is denied authorization to take the program-specific licensure exam due to criminal background information.

An applicant must consider how his/her personal history may affect the ability to meet clinical requirements, sit for various licensure exams, and ultimately gain employment. Most healthcare boards in the State of Florida make decisions about licensure on an individual basis. <u>Please read the following information carefully</u>: Any student who has been found guilty of, regardless of adjudication, or entered a plea of nolo contendere, or guilty to, any offense under the provision of 456.0635 (see below) may be <u>disqualified</u> from admission to any Health Sciences program. 456.0635 Health care fraud; disqualification for license, certificate, or registration.

- (1) Healthcare fraud in the practice of a healthcare profession is prohibited.
- (2) Each board within the jurisdiction of the department, or the department if there is no board, shall refuse to admit a candidate to any examination and refuse to issue a license, certificate, or registration to any applicant if the candidate or applicant or any principal, officer, agent, managing employee, or affiliated person of the candidate or applicant:
- (a) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under chapter 409, chapter 817, or chapter 893, or a similar felony offense committed in another state or jurisdiction, unless the candidate or applicant has successfully completed a pretrial diversion or drug court program for that felony and provides proof that the plea has been withdrawn or the charges have been dismissed.

Any such conviction or plea shall exclude the applicant or candidate from licensure, examination, certification, or registration unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended:

- 1. For felonies of the first or second degree, more than 15 years before the date of application.
- 2. For felonies of the third degree, more than 10 years before the date of application, except for felonies of the third degree under s. 893.13(6)(a).
- 3. For felonies of the third degree under s. <u>893.13(6)(a)</u>, more than 5 years before the date of application;
- (b) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under 21 U.S.C. ss. 801-970, or 42 U.S.C. ss. 1395-1396, unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended more than 15 years before the date of the application;
- (c) Has been terminated for cause from the Florida Medicaid program pursuant to s. <u>409.913</u>, unless the candidate or applicant has been in good standing with the Florida Medicaid program for the most recent 5 years;
- (d) Has been terminated for cause, pursuant to the appeals procedures established by the state, from any other state Medicaid program, unless the candidate or applicant has been in good standing with a state Medicaid program for the most recent 5 years and the termination occurred at least 20 years before the date of the application; or

Any such conviction or plea excludes the applicant from licensure renewal unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended:
 - 1. For felonies of the first or second degree, more than 15 years before the date of application.
- 2. For felonies of the third degree, more than 10 years before the date of application, except for felonies of the third degree under s. 893.13(6)(a).
- 3. For felonies of the third degree under s. <u>893.13(6)(a)</u>, more than 5 years before the date of application.
- (b) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under 21 U.S.C. ss. 801-970, or 42 U.S.C. ss. 1395-1396 since July 1, 2009, unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended more than 15 years before the date of the application.

- (c) Has been terminated for cause from the Florida Medicaid program pursuant to s. <u>409.913</u>, unless the applicant has been in good standing with the Florida Medicaid program for the most recent 5 years.

- (5) The acceptance by a licensing authority of a licensee's relinquishment of a license which is offered in response to or anticipation of the filing of administrative charges alleging health care fraud or similar charges constitutes the permanent revocation of the license.

The following disqualifying offenses under current Florida law for healthcare licensure. The individual must not be awaiting final disposition of charges related to disqualifying offenses. The individual must not have been found guilty, regardless of whether adjudication was withheld, nor have entered a plea of nolo contendere (no contest) or guilty to any disqualifying offense. If the individual was adjudicated delinquent for a disqualifying offense, the record must have been sealed or expunged; otherwise, it remains a disqualifying factor.

Important Note: After acceptance and during enrollment in this program, the student is responsible for notifying the Program Coordinator of any arrest, regardless of adjudication, that occurs after acceptance through graduation.

Failure to promptly notify the Program Coordinator shall be grounds for dismissal from the program.

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

1. Initial Advising and Application

Application information packets are available through the PTA program website at https://www.gulfcoast.edu/academics/academic-division/health-sciences/physical-therapist-assistant/index.html. Applicants assume all responsibility for the completion and submission of all application materials. https://www.gulfcoast.edu in the completion and submission of all application process. https://www.gulfcoast.edu in the student selection materials will not be considered in the student selection process. https://www.gulfcoast.edu in the student selection materials will not be considered in the student selection process. GCSC Physical Therapy Observation Form & page 2 of the Letter of Good Standing Form should be submitted via fax to the Academic Programs Specialist, HealthSciencesGCSC@gulfcoast.edu, by the published application deadline. Applications can be submitted at any time during the academic year and additional materials can be added by the applicant as long as they are received by the published deadline.

2. Admissions Committee

Members of the Admissions Committee will review and rate each application independently, assigning points according to the standards for each admission criterion. Points will be totaled to obtain an overall score for the application. The applicants will be ranked from highest to lowest. The program is piloting interviews this year for the top 30 applicants. This will not affect the candidate's score but is a required part of the selection process. The interviews typically take place during the first week of June.

When all members of the committee have individually completed a review of the applications, the committee will meet as a group to select the class and alternates. The admissions committee adheres to Gulf Coast State College's policies for non-discrimination in student selection. Should there be a tie with the scoring, the admissions committee will use a majority committee vote as the deciding factor in the final student selection. Procedures for compliance with non-discrimination policies and procedures guaranteeing students due process may be found in the GCSC Student Handbook at https://www.gulfcoast.edu/current-students/index.html.

The top *20 students will be offered conditional admission to the program pending a satisfactory background check, drug screen, and physical examination. Should a health problem or disability be identified which appears to make compliance with the technical standards difficult, the applicant will be requested to meet with the admissions committee and a representative from Student Accessibility Resources to discuss a possible way for the program to enhance the applicant's chances of succeeding in the required course and clinical work. See policies re: Student Accessibility Resources (SAR) in the GCSC Student Handbook or in the GCSC General Catalog. If it is not feasible to adapt to the program' technical standards, final acceptance will be withdrawn.

The next 8-10 applicants (by ranked score) will be placed, in order, on an alternate acceptance list for the current program year <u>only</u>, and will be offered conditional admission should a vacancy become available (prior to the first day of class). **No waiting list is maintained for the subsequent year's enrollment and it is the student's responsibility to maintain copies of all application materials for possible reapplication the following year.**

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Applicants will receive email notification of applicant status (interview request, conditional acceptance, alternate, or regret) through their "my.gulfcoast.edu" email account. If offered conditional acceptance or alternate status, those applicants will have **five business days** to respond to the email notification. There is a <u>required response form</u> to confirm acceptance of this status, which must be signed and returned to the program's Senior Administrative Assistant by the specified deadline in June. The required response form should be returned to Ms. Rebecca Acton via fax (850) 747-3246, email to <u>racton@gulfcoast.edu</u>, <u>or</u> in person to HS 309. <u>If we do not receive this form by the deadline, we will extend an offer to the next qualified candidate</u>. If an applicant has not received notification from the program by <u>June 15</u>, please contact Ms. Rebecca Acton to verify that a notification was sent. Please note that applicant status cannot be disclosed by phone. Following confirmation of conditional acceptance, there are additional requirements, including a **mandatory PTA Orientation** held at the end of July and an **Interprofessional Healthcare Training** that should be completed before the beginning of the term in August. A list of specific program requirements for those students with conditional acceptance admission status can be found under the Minimum PTA Program Requirements.

Minimum PTA Program Requirements

Eligibility Requirements

- Meet minimum competency requirements for English/Reading, and Mathematics with testing or complete specific coursework (ENC 1101 & college-level math) with a grade of "C" or higher.
- Earn a minimum GPA of 2.5 for program entry. Once accepted into the program, you must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Meet technical standards for the program
- Must be at least 18 years old by August during the second year of the program, prior to beginning clinical experiences

PTA Applicant Requirements <u>prior</u> to acceptance:

This is a limited-access program; application to the program does not guarantee acceptance to the program.

- 1. Complete the general college application acceptance to the college does not guarantee admission to the program
- 2. Send all official transcripts from both high school and all colleges attended
- 3. Complete the PTA Application application to the PTA program does not guarantee admission
- 4. Review/Initial Technical Standards Form (This is part of the online application)
- 5. Complete the GCSC Physical Therapy Observation Form (2026)
- 6. Submit other supporting documents (certificates, letters, if applicable)

Additional Requirements <u>After</u> Conditional Acceptance:

The following items must be completed in July/August following the receipt of a conditional acceptance email from the program director, prior to the beginning of the fall term (unless otherwise stated).

- 1. **Complete the response form by the deadline** (5 business days from initial notification in June)
- 2. **Complete a satisfactory criminal background check** these results are valid for one year only prior to the start of the PTA technical phase classes. The background check process is repeated in the third term of the program, prior to full-time clinical. Additional background checks may also be required, depending on clinical site placements.
- 3. Submit proof of drug screening results annually & per request from clinical sites.
- 4. Submit a satisfactory physical examination (signed by a licensed medical professional)
- 5. Submit and maintain a report of vaccination history. This includes:
 - a. **Tuberculosis** Provide documentation of a TB skin test. If positive, must provide evidence of a clear chest x-ray and follow-up report. The Mantoux Test (TB skin test) is not as accurate and may not meet some clinical facility requirements. Note: Some facilities require more specific tests, which require a blood sample (QuantiFERON Gold or T Spot).
 - b. **Hepatitis B** Provide documentation of starting the first dose of the Hepatitis B vaccine or a lab report of a positive antibody titer. The vaccine for Hepatitis B is highly recommended. It is a series of either two or three shots administered within a specific timeframe. The full series should be completed <u>prior to</u> the second fall term. If a student chooses not to have the vaccine, a signed declination/waiver form is required.
 - c. **Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (TDAP)** Provide documentation of these immunizations, and the tetanus shot must have been given within the past 10 years.

Additional Requirements After Conditional Acceptance (continued)...

- d. Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR) Provide documentation of two doses of live-measles-containing vaccine or positive titer, documentation of prior physician-diagnosed measles disease, or laboratory evidence of measles immunity for students born in or after 1957. Students can be admitted after receiving the first dose.
- e. **Poliomyelitis** Provide documentation of oral polio, polio vaccine, or declination per healthcare provider.
- f. **Varicella** (Chicken Pox) Provide documentation of two doses of this vaccine or positive titer results.
- g. **Annual Flu Vaccination** Provide documentation of the annual flu shot administered specific to the current flu season (Fall/Winter). If a student opts not to receive the flu shot, a signed declination/waiver is required. Note: The flu vaccination is not typically available until September in the fall semester, thus not required prior to the first fall term.
- h. **COVID-19 Vaccination** Provide documentation of the annual COVID-19 shot administered specific to the current season (Fall/Winter). If a student opts not to receive the COVID-19 shot, a signed declination/waiver is required. Note: The COVID-19 vaccination will not typically be available until mid-September in the fall semester, thus not required prior to the first fall term.
- 6. **CPR** Submit proof of CPR certification by the end of the first Fall term. (American Heart Association Basic Life Support for the Healthcare Provider Professional is preferred.)
- 7. **Attend Physical Therapist Assistant Program Orientation** This is a mandatory program orientation that takes place at the end of July (typically on the third or fourth Wednesday, from 1:00 p.m. 5:00 p.m.) prior to entering the first Fall term.
- 8. **Complete Interprofessional Healthcare Training** (online by August, prior to the first Fall term)
- 9. Complete all curriculum courses with a grade of "C" or higher and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0. All general education courses should be completed by the end of the third semester (summer term), prior to beginning clinical coursework.
- 10. **Provide proof of health insurance** upon request for clinical placement during the third semester.
- 11. **Read and comply with program policies as specified in the PTA Program Handbook**, found on the program website under Resources <u>Gulf Coast State College | Physical Therapist Assistant Resources</u>
